About Valleyfest

Valleyfest is an annual tradition bringing the greater Spokane Valley region together since 1990. The community-wide celebration is held each September at Mirabeau Point Park and CenterPlace Regional Event Center in the Spokane Valley. Valleyfest provides live entertainment for the entire family, an opportunity to meet and have fun with friends, and recognize area youth for their talents.

Mission

The Valleyfest mission is to produce community driven, safe, family oriented, visually dramatic festivals. Valleyfest exposes the talent that enriches the Spokane Valley region and celebrates the visual and performing arts, education, science, and recreation so the entire community can experience them.

Organization Overview

Valleyfest, a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization that began in 1990, produces a 3-day community festival each September. Our volunteer driven work force strives to plan, produce, and advocate the finest cultural event in the City of Spokane Valley.

Requirements & Expectations

Valleyfest has entrusted you with this special privilege and we trust you to represent Valleyfest whether you are at a Valleyfest sponsored event or in your own home. Not only is the community watching you and looking up to you, but so are your future employers. Below are some guidelines to follow during your time as part of the Miss Spokane Valley Scholarship Program.

General

- Be a full time female high school Sophomore or Junior;
- Have accumulated a grade point average of at least 3.0 at the time of application based on a 4.0 system, good citizenship, and school attendance;
- Be a resident of Spokane Valley, WA;
- Be able to meet the time commitment and job responsibilities as set forth by Valleyfest;
- Refrain from possessing, selling or any personal involvement with alcohol, any controlled substance, or non-prescription mind, personality, or mood altering substance from the time I sign this document through my tenure as royalty;
- Absolutely no use or possession of tobacco products while representing Valleyfest and the Miss Spokane Valley Program;
- Refrain from engaging in gossip at all times;
- Maintain a pleasant attitude at all events during year of reign.

Cell Phones & Technology

- Respond in a timely manner to all event/appearance requests and any Miss Spokane Valley related engagement (via email, phone call, and/or text message);
- Refrain from using cell phones during Valleyfest events. Phones must be turned off and out of sight during events.

Social Media

- Photos and posts should be in good taste;

- Absolutely no illegal substances (drugs/ alcohol) or inappropriate language or gestures should be visible (you cannot post or be tagged in a post);
- You must allow Valleyfest to follow you on all your social media accounts (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Pinterest, LinkedIn, etc.).

Appearance & Attire

- Good personal hygiene is to be maintained at all times;
- Hair should be neat and clean;
- Agreed upon clothing should be clean and in good repair;
- Crowns and sashes should be worn to all events unless otherwise discussed;
- Crowns are not to be worn unless in the presence of a designated Miss Spokane Valley chaperone at a Valleyfest approved event.

Inability to follow requirements and expectations set forth may result in removal from the court and forfeit of all benefits and scholarships.
